## **SUPPLY LIST**

#### Fabric Requirements:

## Large Quilt 79" x 79" (shown)

- Light background 3 ¾ yd.
- Scraps to equal approx. 2 ½ yd.
- Sashing and first border 1 ¼ yd.
- Outer border 1 yd.
- Binding ¾ yd.

## Lap Quilt 54" x 54"

- Light background 1 % vd.
- Scraps to equal 1 ¾ yd.
- Sashing and first border ½ yd.
- Outer border ¾ yd.
- Binding ½ yd.

## You should also bring:

- Pre-cut fabric labeled as specified on page 2.
- · Your machine with foot pedal and power cord.
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade
- Cutting mat
- Straight pins, scissors, seam ripper and anything else you normally use when sewing
- Pencil for taking notes and marking as needed.
- Basic ruler for cutting fabric once we go over flying geese options.
- · Iron and ironing surface
- Magic sizing or best press if you use it.

# Page 2 Scrappily Ever After

## Pre-cutting for Pineapple Pinwheels blocks:

Explanation of abbreviations BD= border/ BC= block corners/ BL= block

#### 79" x 79" Quilt:

- Cut (7) 2 ½" strips WOF of <u>background</u>. Sub-cut into (104) 2 ½" squares. Place (68) of the squares in a Ziploc and label them "2 ½" BD." Bag (36) separately and label use first.
- Cut (15) 3 ½" strips WOF of <u>background</u>. Sub-cut into (176) 3 ½" squares. Divide them into (3) sets.
   36/72/68. Place the (36) in a Ziploc and label "BC." Place the (72) in a Ziploc and label "3 ½ BL." Place the remaining (68) in a Ziploc and label "3 ½" BD."
- <u>Using your colorful scraps</u>, cut (208) 1 %" x 2 ½" rectangles. <u>Use as many colors as possible</u>. (If you have left over jelly roll strips in your scraps use them! They are already 2 ½" wide so it's easy to cross-cut them into 2 ½" x 1 ¾" rectangles.) In addition, pull out your smallest scraps and see how many you can cut from them. Divide the 2 ½" x 1 ¾" rectangles into (2) sets. Place (136) in a Ziploc bag and label "BD." Bag (72) and label use now.

## 54" x 54" Lap Quilt:

- Cut (4) 2 ½" strips WOF of <u>background</u>. Sub-cut into (60) 2 ½" squares. Place (44) of the squares in a Ziploc and label them "2 ½" BD." Bag (16) separately and label use first.
- Cut (8) 3 ½" strips WOF of <u>background</u>. Sub-cut into (92) 3 ½" squares. Divide them into (3) sets.
   16/32/44. Place the (16) in a Ziploc and label "BC." Place (32) in a Ziploc and label "3 ½ BL." Place the remaining (44) in a Ziploc and label "3 ½" BD."
- <u>Using your colorful scraps</u>- cut (120) 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles. <u>Use as many colors as possible</u>. (If you have left over jelly roll strips in your scraps- use them! They are already 2 ½" wide so it's easy to cross-cut them into 2 ½" x 1 ¾" rectangles.) In addition, pull out your smallest scraps and see how many you can cut from them. Divide the 2 ½" x 1 ¾" rectangles into (2) sets. Place (88) in a Ziploc bag and label "BD." Bag (32) and label use now.

## More cuts: All of these cuts will be colorful scraps. (NO BACKGROUND)

#### For larger Quilt:

- Cut (72) 1 ½" x 5" rectangles. Cut (136) additional 1 ½" x 5" and put in Ziploc labeled "5 BD."
- Cut (72) 1 ¾" x 4 ½" and put in bag labeled "4 ½" BL."
- Cut (72) 1 %" x 7" rectangles and put in a bag labeled "7" BL."

## For Lap Quilt:

- Cut (32) 1 ½" x 5" rectangles. Cut (88) additional 1 ½" x 5" and put in a Ziploc labeled "5" BD."
- Cut (32) 1 ¾" x 4 ½" and put in a bag labeled "4 ½" BL."
- Cut (32) 1 %" x 7" rectangles and put in a bag labeled "7" BL."

Bring all fabric left after making the above cuts to use for flying geese. Cut nothing for the geese until we go over the technique options in class.
